DIRECTOR'S REPORT
Use Measures: Reviewed

Financials:

A comparison report was provided for the library budget, current through December, 2016. A report showing running fund balance, current through November, 2016 was also been provided.

#### **Administration:**

The library is part of a collaborative grant project through Superiorland Library Cooperative that would provide \$500,000 over 3 years for outreach services. The City budget process for FY 2017-18 is underway. A preliminary informational session for City council is scheduled for Tuesday, January 24<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 a.m. A complete schedule has been provided with this packet. The State Aid Report for Fiscal Year 15-16 is due February 2<sup>nd</sup>. State Aid is expected at .32 per capita this year for a total of roughly \$16,000 Library director has met with Hope at the Inn executive director and staff from the Salvation Army to discuss how we can work effectively with shelter residents.

#### **Library Programs / Services:**

The library has applied for a Michigan Notable Author grant from the Michigan Center for the Book. Activities are being planned for Teen Tech Week in March. A selection of streaming video is now available through the Great Lakes Digital Library. The startup collection was funded by Superiorland Library Cooperative.

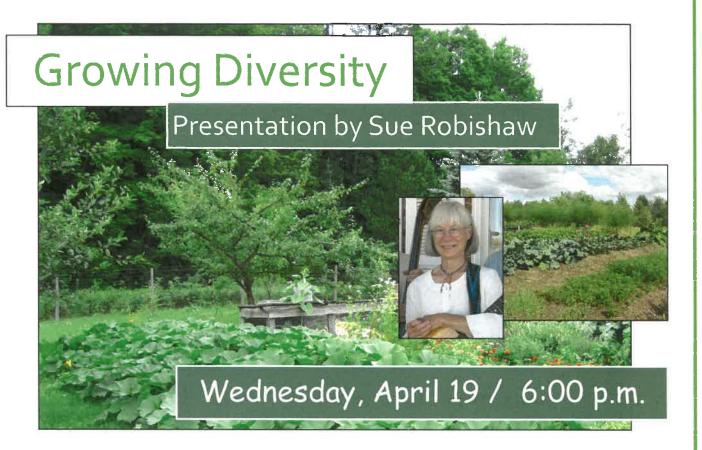

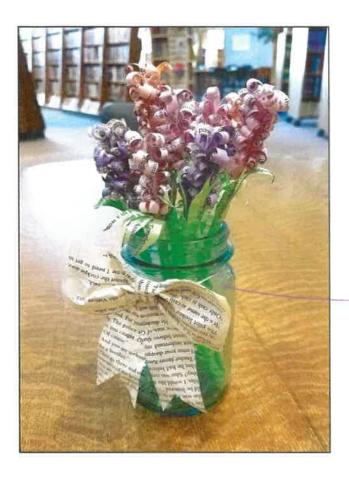
