

Public Safety News

Public Safety officials would like to remind the public about the dangers of fentanyl. Recently, there have been several fentanyl-related awareness events in the area, prompted by a sharp increase in drug-related deaths involving the substance across the US.

Fake pills are the primary cause behind the growing number of fentanyl-related deaths among young people. It is important for parents and caregivers to have open and ageappropriate conversations with their children about the drug.

Fentanyl is up to 50 times stronger than heroin and 100 times stronger than morphine.

In 2020, 76% of drug deaths in people 14-26 involved fentanyl.

To reduce the risk, it's crucial to only take pills prescribed by a doctor, avoid mixing substances, and watch out for one another. Maintaining clear and open communication with your children helps them feel comfortable enough to speak up and seek help in potentially dangerous situations.

We understand that these discussions can be difficult, but by coming together as a community and taking practical steps like those mentioned above, we can begin pushing back against fentanyl.



Planning & Zoning News

The Planning & Zoning Department has a few meetings in May. On the 9th at 6:00 pm, the Planning Commission meets to discuss a few different issues of importance including a Special Land Use application for a proposed ice cream store, a proposed motor vehicle maintenance ordinance, and the proposed 2024 Capital Improvement Plan.

The Zoning Board of Appeals meets on the 21st at 6:00 pm to look over a variance request. As always, the public is encouraged to attend both meetings. Residents who are concerned about zoning violations are encouraged to contact the Department or fill out a complaint form, which can be provided if asked. We are working hard to make Escanaba a safer place for everyone.

Utilities/ Public Works News

Public Works has been keeping busy over the last month with tree trimming and are making great progress with the backlog of problem trees. They were able to clean up from the storm in three days, a job that previously would have taken them a month for a similar-sized storm. The department would also like to thank the residents for their patience during the cleanup and for their supportive comments toward the crews.

The Department is also planning some longterm work in area parks and playgrounds. While the playgrounds have served residents well, it is time to look at some updates and fixes so that future generations can enjoy them, too.

The Department would also like to remind residents to remember to get a Spring Clean Up Voucher at City Hall this year!

The Water/Wastewater Department is staying busy with major projects happening throughout the City. While the work can be disruptive, crews are working fast to make sure that residents have access to clean drinking water and safe roads. They would like to thank the public for their understanding and patience during these projects and assure residents that they are doing everything they can to keep the disruptions to a minimum. The Department is also hosting informational meetings on the 1st Wednesday of the month in the Council Chambers in City Hall at 6:00 p.m. The meeting subjects will vary by month but will help the public understand and prepare for upcoming City projects that may impact them. The public is encouraged to attend.

The Electric Department would like to remind the public about their Energy Optimization Program. The program is for residential, commercial, and industrial customers who would like to reduce their energy usage, lower costs, and earn rebates. To qualify, you must be an electric utility customer through the City of Escanaba and your account must be current. The appliances must also be labeled with a blue Energy Star logo.

Brownfield Redevelopment Authority

The work that boards and commissions do shouldn't be a mystery. Each month we go over one board or commission, explain what they do, and give you information on how you can get involved!

In 1997, Escanaba's City Council decided that creating a Brownfield Redevelopment Authority would be in the best interest of the public. The City of Escanaba Brownfield Authority (CEBRA) designates Brownfield redevelopment zones and individual properties that are functionally obsolete or are likely to be environmentally distressed pursuant to Act 381 of 1996.

The goal of this Authority is to encourage the reuse and redevelopment of property which is less desirable than "greenfields" – property which has not been previously developed by reimbursing developers for costs involved in making damaged property as desirable as untouched property. Good candidates for board membership might include individuals with a background or interest in real estate, finance, business, law, and planning.

The Brownfield Redevelopment Authority meets at the call of the Chair.

Recreation Rental Information



Ludington Park Pavillion

Located near the south end of Ludington Park, the pavillion has ample 110-volt electric service, potable water, and a large capacity BBQ grill. Included are 10 eight- person picnic tables with ample green space surrounding.

1/2 day fee of \$75 resident and \$100 non-resident. Full day fee of \$100 resident and \$125 non-resident.



Ludington Park Gazebo

Located across from Sand Point Lighthouse, the 20' x 20' gazebo is equipped with electrical outlets and external lighting. On street parking is available with bathrooms available at the Municipal Marina.

\$50 fee per two-hour block for resident and \$75 for nonresident.



Band Shell

Located on the south end of Ludington Park, the facility can seat up to 300 people with plenty of green space for other spectators. Parking for up to 100 vehicles and restrooms are available close by.

Day fee of \$75 for resident and \$100 for non-resident. Full-day fee of \$100 for resident and \$125 for non-resident.



Escanaba Marketplace

Located across from the Upper Elementary, the Marketplace boasts an 8,000 sq. ft. pavilion, restrooms, commercial kitchen, sound stage, fire pit, and a fenced in playground! Included are 40 tables, 200 chairs, and a parking area.

Day fee for residents is \$150. Please contact the DDA for reservations at 906-789-8696
